
OUR MISSION

Thank You to our Funders

Thank you to the Ensworth Charitable Foundation, Evelyn W. Preston Memorial Trust Fund, and the George A. & Grace L. Long Foundation for their support of our educational mission. All three Foundations, which provide competitive grants to Hartford-area nonprofits, were created by generous benefactors who now reside at Cedar Hill.

Antoinette L. Ensworth established the **Ensworth Charitable Foundation** in 1948 to support a variety of activities including art and cultural programming. Miss Ensworth served as president and treasurer of L.L. Ensworth and Son, one of the oldest hardware firms in the country.

Created in 1960, the **George A. & Grace**L. Long Foundation promotes quality educational, cultural, human services, and health care programming in Connecticut.
George Long was president of the Gray Pay Telephone Company in Hartford, which manufactured the first pay telephones in the United States.

In 1921, Civil War veteran and Travelers executive Maj. Edward V. Preston bequeathed money to establish the **Evelyn W. Preston Memorial Trust Fund**, named in honor of his daughter. Augmenting the initial gift with her own substantial bequest, Miss Preston wished to support free summer concerts in Hartford.

We are enormously grateful for the support of these three Foundations. Grant funding enables us to offer creative programming showcasing Cedar Hill's art, history and natural beauty.

Cedar Hill Cemetery Foundation shares the art, history and natural beauty of our cemetery with visitors through a variety of activities including nature walks, thematic tours, concert, movie and more. We are delighted to be offering several new thematic walks highlighting our rich historic and artistic resources this season.

On July 22, we will present *Sam & Elizabeth's World*. Elizabeth Colt erected the first major monument at Cedar Hill, one of her many efforts to commemorate her husband's legacy in Connecticut's capital city. This new tour, which begins at the Colt Monument on Section 2 at 10:00 am, will introduce you to Colt family members as well as friends and associates of this influential couple.

In the afternoon of July 22, you are invited to visit the *Church of Good Shepherd & Caldwell Hart Colt Memorial Parish House*. At 1:00 pm, senior warden Jack Hale will discuss Elizabeth Colt's elaborate tributes to Sam, their children, numerous family members

Learn about monument styles often found in 19th-century cemeteries on the *Stories in Stone* walking tour on August 12. From the sarcophagus to the obelisk, Celtic cross, pyramid and more, Foundation Director Beverly Lucas will discuss the artistic and architectural design of our illustrious memorials.

Popular tour guide, Patrick Haggerty, will lead the new tour, *The Prosecution Rests*, on September 30. From the assassination of President Garfield to the crimes that inspired the movie *Arsenic and*

Old Lace, he will share intriguing stories of sensational trials, tragic crimes and even one unsolved mystery, all of which gripped the imagination of Connecticut residents.

Five in the Chamber

The Foundation will present a free concert featuring the popular Connecticut band, *Five in the Chamber*, on July 28.

Voted Fan Favorite at the 2016 Podunk Bluegrass Festival, *Five in the Chamber's* tight arrangements and unique harmony vocals bring a fresh interpretation to the bluegrass songbook.

The New Haven-based band features Ken McEwen on guitar and vocals, Pete Kaufman on banjo and vocals, Dave Casali on upright bass and vocals, Kat Wallace on fiddle and vocals, and David Sasso on mandolin and vocals.

Formed in 2011, the band has built a catalog of original songs that showcase the group's strong vocals, musicianship, and passion for genre busting.

The band released their debut album, *Live in the Chamber*, in the fall of 2013 to rave reviews and is currently working on a new EP of original music.

Music Among the Memorials will be held Friday, July 28 at 6:00 p.m. on the lawn between the community mausoleums. The band will perform two sets with a 15-minute intermission. Bring blankets, chairs and picnic dinners for a musical evening to remember.

Join us for Cedar Hill Cemetery Foundation's *Movie Night* in August. In honor of Cedar Hill resident Katharine Hepburn, we will be showing *Stage Door*, co-starring Hepburn and Ginger Rogers on Thursday, August 24 at 7:30 p.m. (raindate Friday, August 25).

In this 1937 movie, Hepburn and Rogers star as aspiring actresses who live in a rooming house filled with theatrical hopefuls. Get caught up in their ambitions, dreams and disappointments as they all try to make it on Broadway.

Stage Door presents a new, inspired Katharine Hepburn, who had been criticized for "flat, mechanical performances" in several previous movies. And it showcases Ginger Rogers outside of her Fred Astaire dance partnership. The movie also features supporting actress Andrea Leeds, who earned an Oscar nomination. Look for Lucille Ball, Eve Arden and Ann Miller who play minor characters in the film.

The movie will be shown on an outdoor

screen on the sprawling lawn between the community mausoleums. Bring a blanket or chair to enjoy the show.

Hallowed History Lantern Tour

One of our most popular programs is the *Hallowed History Lantern Tour*, annually held on the Friday before Halloween. Led by lantern light, the tour winds through the historic sections of the cemetery

where guests meet character actors who bring tantalizing true stories to life.

The tour provides an occasion to meet Cedar Hill's interesting although often lesser-known residents such as the actress Baroness Fern Andra, Titanic survivor Richard Beckwith or aviation pioneer Edson Gallaudet. And it offers the opportunity to hear stories of intrigue, mystery and more. There is even an occasional humorous story to be shared.

Each year we look for new tales to tell, with the *Hartford Courant* archives providing much of the information needed to prepare scripts. The stories are not scary, but since they may touch on tragic events, the program is not recommended for children under the age of 13.
